Our school actively supports and implements Article 17 of the UNICEF Rights Respecting Schools by ensuring students have access to reliable and age-appropriate information through a variety of sources. We provide a well-stocked library, each classroom has their own mini library, safe and supervised internet access, and lessons on media literacy to help students critically evaluate and responsibly use information. Through assemblies, classroom discussions. collaborative projects, we promote awareness of diverse perspectives while fostering respect for cultural differences. Additionally, we work closely with parents and external organisations to expand learning opportunities, ensuring that every student's right to information is respected and upheld.
