## Rights Respecting Schools



Article 40states that a child accused or guilty of breaking the law must be treated with dignity and respect. They have the right to legal assistance and a fair that trial takes account of their age. Governments must set a minimum age for children to be

tried in a criminal court and manage a justice system that enables children who have been in conflict with the law to reintegrate into society.

Our school upholds Article 40 of the UNICEF Rights Respecting Schools framework by fostering a supportive and restorative approach to behaviour management. We ensure that all students are treated with dignity and fairness, promoting conflict resolution through discussion and positive understanding. By encouraging relationships, teaching responsibility, providing appropriate support, we students learn from their actions while feeling valued and respected within the school community.
